The Adams County Youth Initiative (ACYI) is honored to continue our partnership to support you by providing the results of the 2016 Adams County Student Survey (ACSS).

The Adams County Student Survey has been administered each of the past nine school years (2008- 2016) to students in grades 6 through 12. Beginning last year, 2015, the ACSS expanded its reach and launched its elementary version, surveying students in grades 3-5 across our five partner school districts. This unique, annual, census-level survey is one of the most comprehensive in the country – with approximately 27,000 students completing it annually, and an average response rate of 75 percent.

Originally, ACYI began providing this service to schools and districts with the aim of filling a significant data void in our region. While we are pleased to have done this and still look forward to meeting this need, we have also taken time to reflect on ACYI's role in the annual survey process, carefully considering how to add further value to our partnership. ACYI's overall role within the partnership is to guide a shared vision and goals, to support continuous improvement across our partnership and to advance policy and mobilize funding to improve student outcomes across the six cradle to career outcomes (kindergarten readiness, 3rd grade reading, 8th grade math, high school graduation, post-secondary enrollment and post-secondary completion). We know that healthy communities closely monitor these key outcome areas and ACYI is proud to support improvement toward these ends.

In this vein, ACYI is currently working through how to more closely align the ACSS with the work of moving the needle on cradle to career outcomes while still ensuring it fulfills the unique needs of each of our partner school districts. As we consider the best next steps to take the ACSS to the next level we welcome your input and feedback on the survey content, implementation process, reports, and/or how to most effectively utilize the results. We look forward to your thoughts on how to improve and add value to your work, and ultimately student success in the future.

Disclaimer

The 2016 Adams County Student Survey was customized by school district. Customization offered each district the opportunity to glean important information related to grants, specific programs, outcomes or factors that they believed would be beneficial to understand from the student perspective. The focus of this county-level report is to highlight the outcomes of the ACSS that apply to the entire ACYI partnership. As such, only the survey items included in all five district instruments are reported here.

Additionally, please note that after thoughtful reflection, ACYI has calculated the county response rate differently this year than in years past. As students have always been permitted to skip items they did not want to answer, past practice has been to remove those “non-response” or blank items when analyzing the response rates for each question. This year, ACYI carefully considered this practice and decided to align its survey analysis with its core values around student voice. ACYI is firmly committed to administering and reporting the Adams County Student Survey as a means of elevating the voices of our most important stakeholders; our students. In this vein, ACYI determined its best practice to leave all student responses in the sample. In so doing, the overall sample size for each question is truly representative of the students who took the survey and the response rate is reflective of the percentage of students who took the survey that answered in the reported categories (The reported categories are notes for each question.).

To ensure this shift did not have any inadvertent or adverse effects, a secondary analysis of the sample was also run that is congruent with past practice. Though that data is not included in this report, it did confirm that questions showing a significant change in student response from 2015 to 2016 demonstrated the same trend when analyzed both ways. The idea of trend is what is most important and should be the focus of analysis when accounting for 2015 to 2016 changes in data.

When consuming this information please bear the following in mind:

1. The ACSS, in its present form relies on students reporting behaviors, attitudes and incidences. While high school students are often more likely to self-report than their middle school aged peers, the self-reported accounts contained in the information presented in this report may not be fully accurate.
2. Evidence of survey fatigue is present in the data set, indicating that students may have become disengaged during the survey session. As a result, the following data, although valuable, should be consumed with caution.
3. The Spanish and English survey versions were not congruent with one another. Questions were asked in the Spanish language version that were not included in the English language version and vice versa. Additionally, the question sequence between the two instruments was different. As a result, only the questions to which the majority of respondents answered have been included in this report. The adjustment to question sequence in the Spanish language version may have impacted student responses and the data should be consumed with appropriate caution.
4. Additionally, bear in mind that customization to the 2016 ACSS instruments led to significant variation in each districts’ survey tools. While the information included in this report is limited to survey items contained in each of the five participating district instruments, variability is likely to still exist. As each instrument asked questions in a different order and each were of varying overall length, survey fatigue, framing, and priming may have impacted the reliability of the results.
5. In the year to year comparison, percent changes (2015 to 2016) will be larger than they have been in years past due to all students being included in the sample. The trend (overall increase or decrease in student responses) is what is most important here, not the specific percentage change.

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Methods/Sample

Response Rates:

Across all five partner school districts, **35,586** students completed the Adams County Student Survey. Students who participated ranged in grade from **3rd through 12th**. As of the 2016 "October Count", enrollment of participating grades/schools was **42,487**. Given this year's enrollment and the number of students who participated, the **overall response rate** for the 2016 ACSS was **83.75%**.

In survey work, utilizing a census-based administration, a high response rate is required. High response rates achieve adequate power to demonstrate changes from one year to the next and to ensure that the sample who took part in the survey is representative of the larger population (i.e., all students). Whether differences exist between those students who responded to the survey compared to those who did not is not known. Therefore, care must be taken in generalizing the results to the entire school population.

Table 1 represents the number of students who completed the survey and the response rate in each grade level.

Survey Sample Characteristics:

The gender distribution of the students surveyed was **48.9% female, 49.1% male and 0.9% transgender**. The following tables present, in more detail, the demographic makeup of the students who responded to the survey.

Table 2 shows the racial/ethnic background of the students who completed the survey for the school. Students could choose more than one category. Students were asked separately if they were Hispanic or Latino.

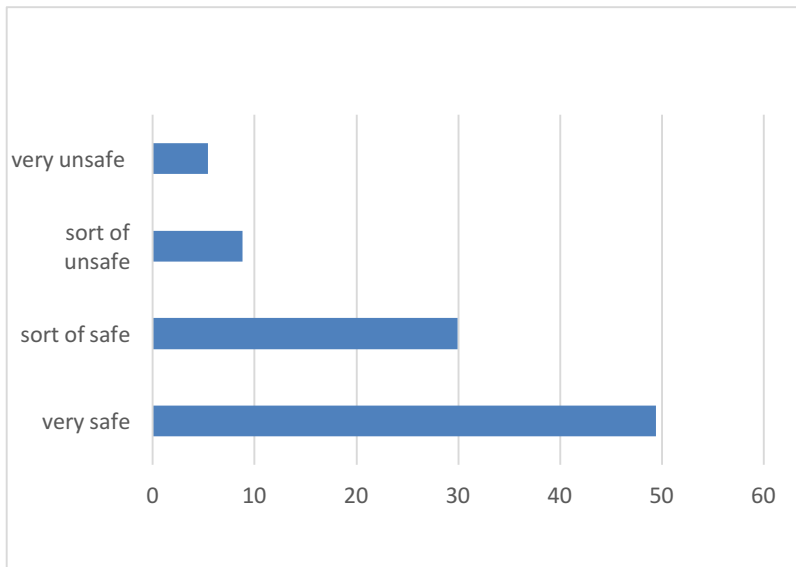

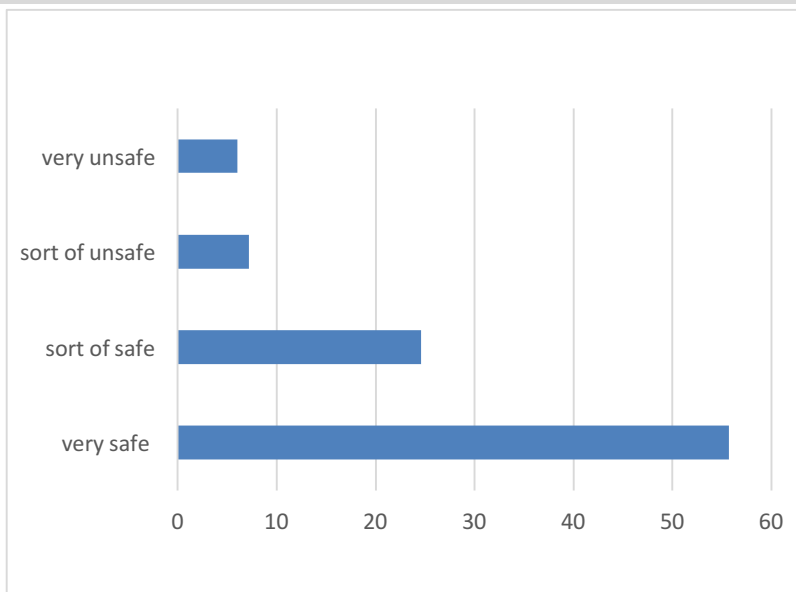

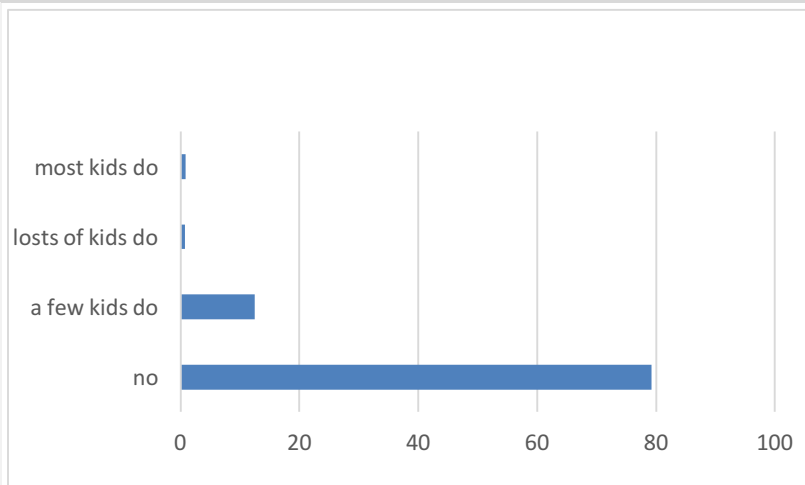
Do you feel safe at school? (Percent response by category.)



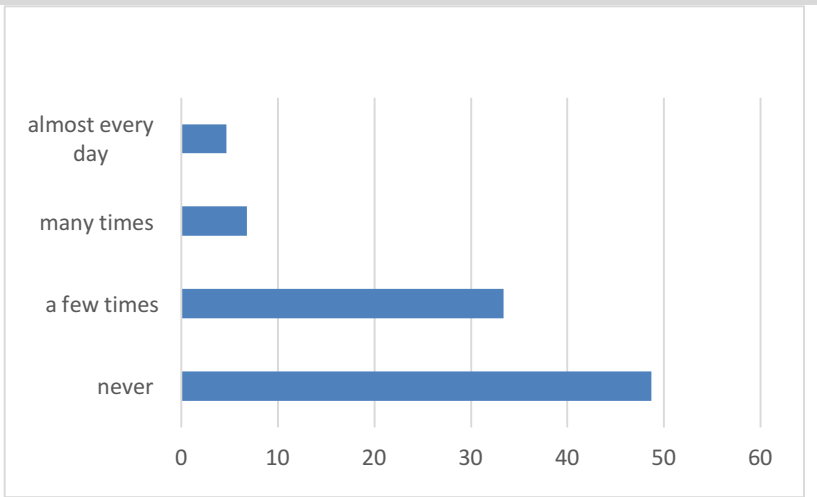
Do you feel safe on your way to and from school? (Percent response by category.)

Have you been bullied at school? (Percent response by category.)

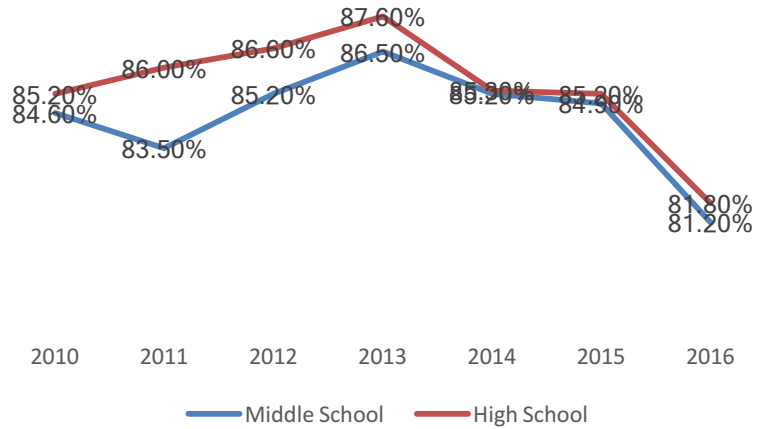

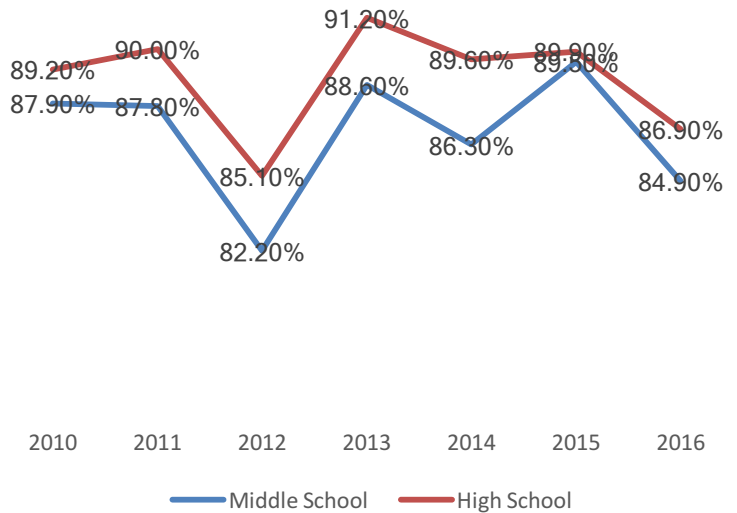

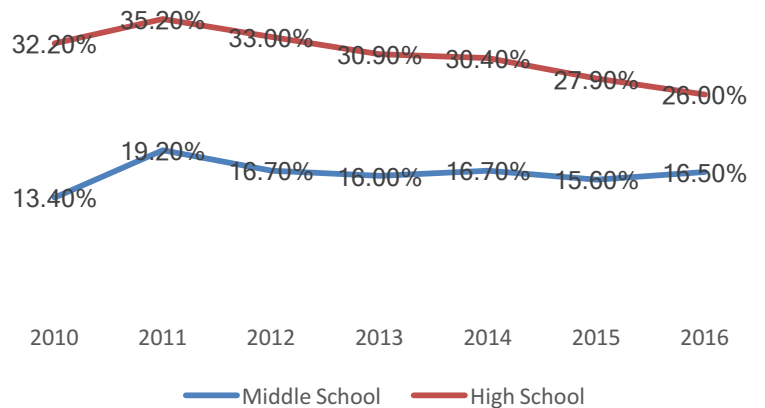
I feel safe at my school. (Percent that “agree” or “strongly agree”)

How many whole days of school have you missed because you skipped or “cut” (not because you were sick or had an excused absence)? (Percent responding one or more days in the past 30 days)

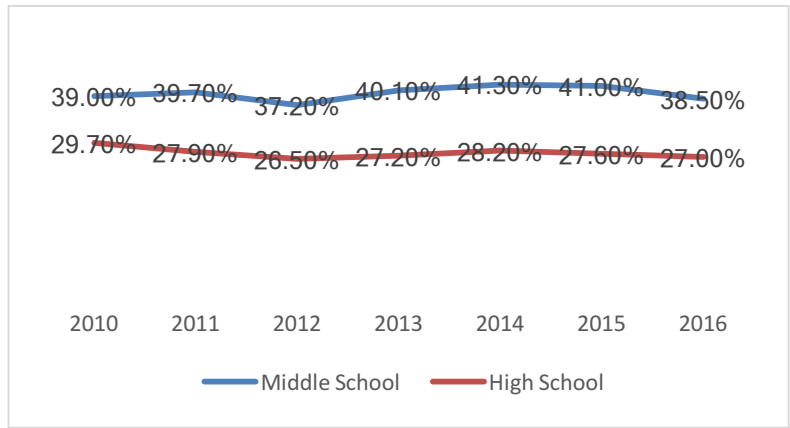

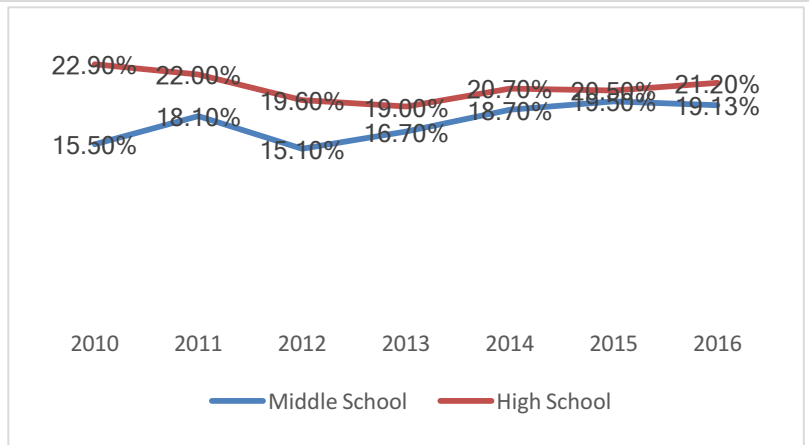

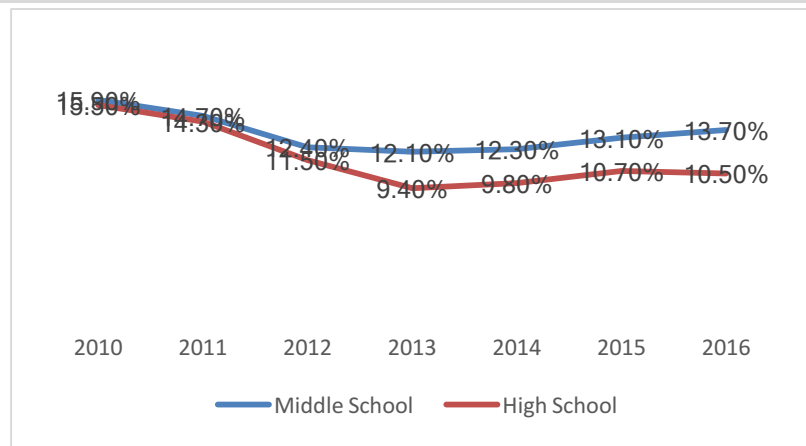
Have you been insulted or threatened by others using the internet or a cell phone?

(Percent responding **one or more times** in the past 12 months)



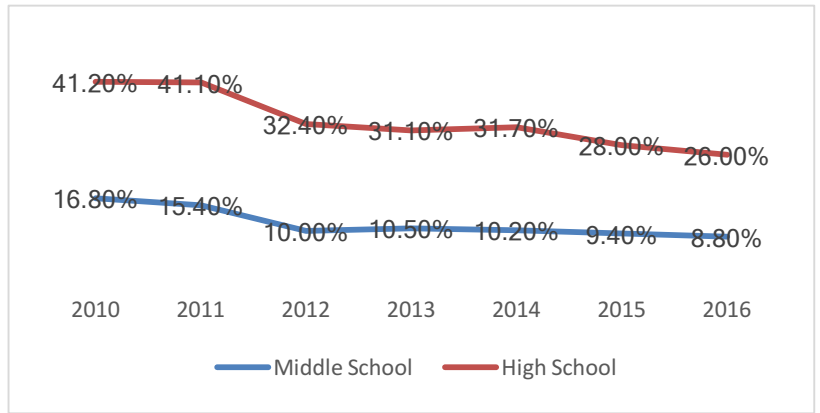

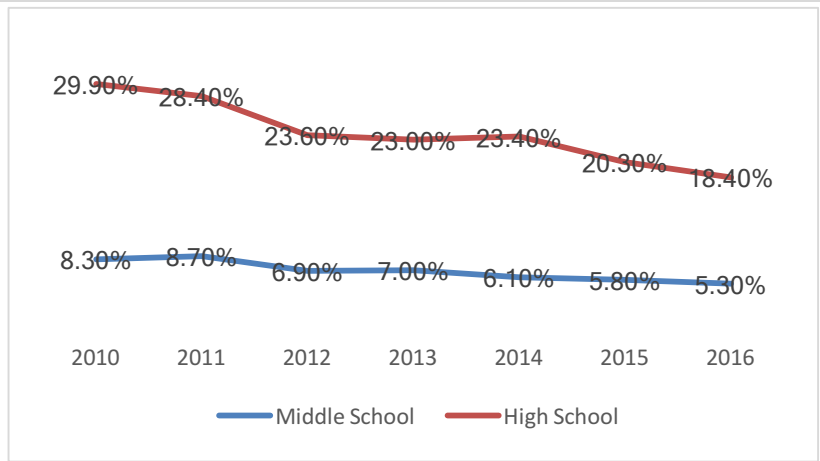

Marijuana Use:

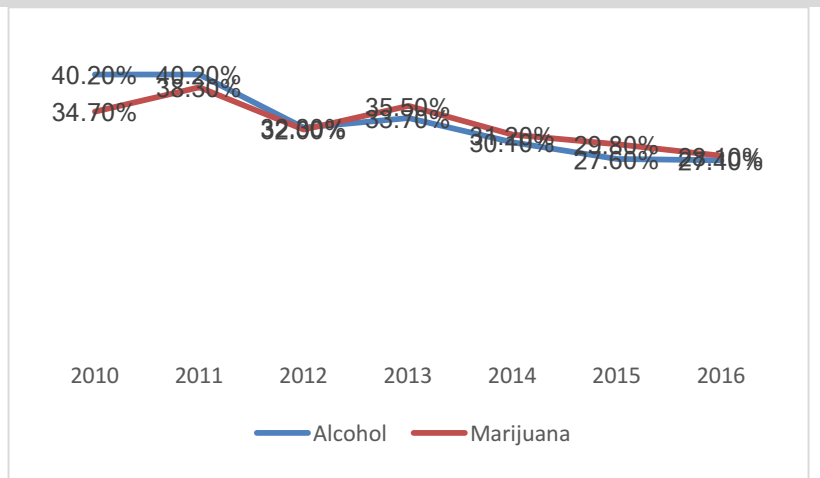
How many days in the last 30 did you use marijuana?

(Percent responding one or more days)



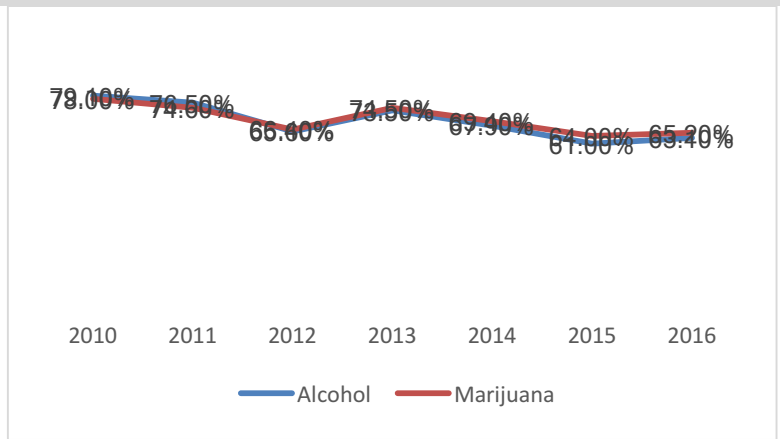

How many days in the past 30 do you think a typical student at your school used marijuana? (Percent responding one or more days)



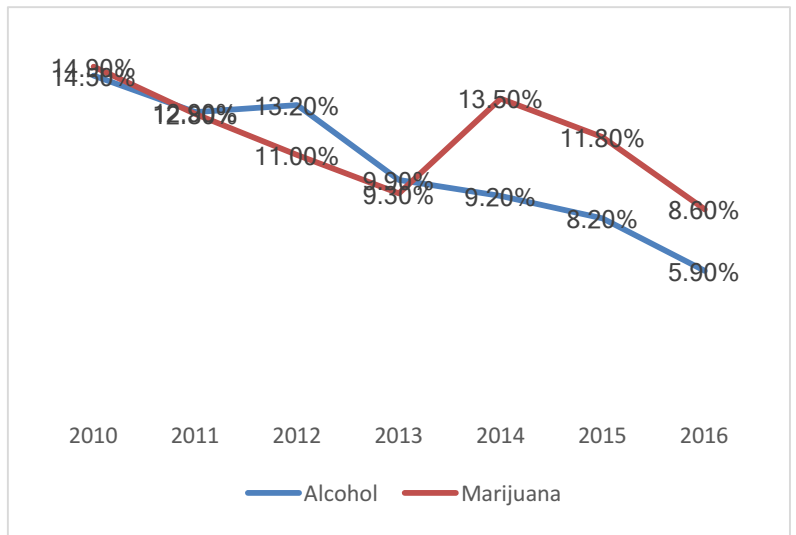

How many days in the past 30 do you think a *typical* student at your school used marijuana? (Percent responding one or more days)



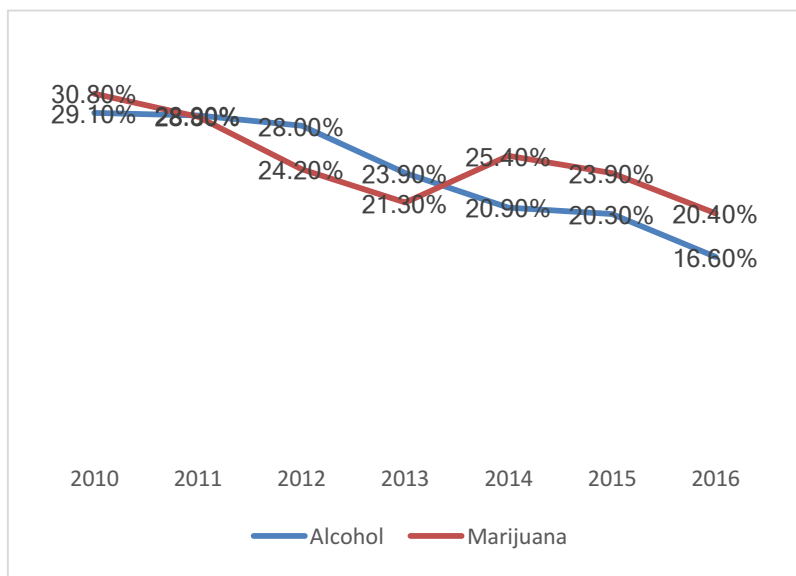

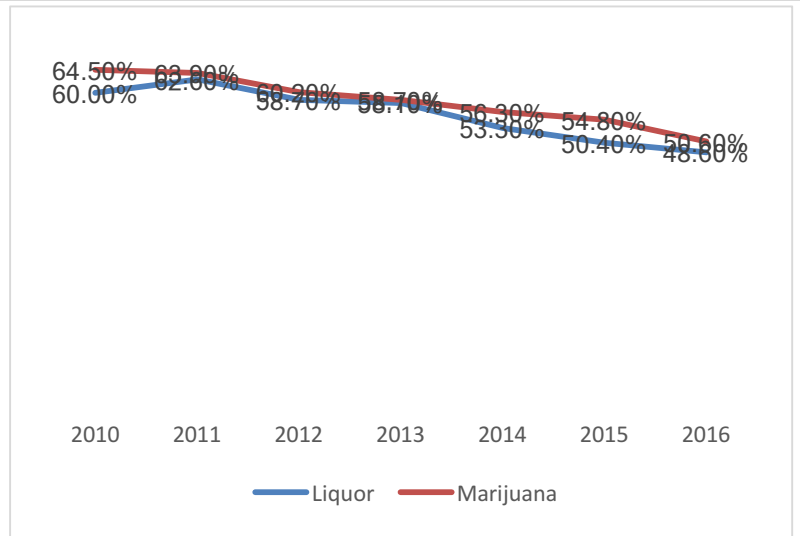

Elementary School - All Results

The elementary version of the ACSS is still in its pilot phase. The results below demonstrate the County aggregate based on the available data however only four of the five Partner Districts participated in the elementary survey and of those, only one included all elementary schools. Year over year data is not presented for this pilot instrument due to significant changes in sample size from the inaugural pilot in 2015-16 to the expanded pilot in 2016-17. Additionally, response rates may not total 100% as students were permitted to skip questions.

Observations, Findings and Recommendations

After thorough review of the 2016 Adams County Student Survey instrument, administration process and data, the following observations and findings were identified. In response to these observations and findings, the recommendations contained in the final portion of this section have been presented as way to strengthen the Adams County Student Survey.

Observations

1. Response rates were fairly consistent and over 75% in grades 3-10. Response rates in grades 11 and 12 were significantly lower than the rest of the participating grade levels. Given these grade levels had response rates below 75%, it is important to have adjusted the administration protocol from a census-level administration to a random sample. It is unclear if the administration protocol was adjusted at these sites.
2. There is consistency in the constructs (AKA themes or topics. IE: substance use, safety, etc) measured between the elementary, middle and high school instruments.
3. Notably higher non-response rates for questions pertaining to questions with clear social expectations (IE those related to weapons and methamphetamines).
4. Notably higher non-response rates for substance use questions targeting students' perceptions of their friends' behavior compared to the non-response rates for the same items asking about their own behavior.

Findings

1. **Evidence of survey fatigue.** While evidence of survey fatigue varied across each district, data from districts who opted for longer instruments showed distinct evidence of survey fatigue.
2. **Variation in sample size.** In 2015, two of the largest schools who typically participate in the ACSS did not participate. In 2016, they returned to the sample, significantly changing the sample size. Additionally, analysis in previous years removed incomplete surveys from the sample by question while analysis this year included all respondents.
3. **Qualified statements.** In some items, qualifying language or language that expresses abstract limitations was included. For example, in the question, "Outside of my home or school there is an adult who really cares about me" the term "really" is a qualifier. The term "really" is subjective and likely to be interpreted differently by each respondent.

Recommendations

1. Standardize the length of all ACSS instruments. For elementary students, keep the survey administration time to 35 minutes or less. For middle school and high school students, survey administration time should not exceed 60 minutes and the instrument should be limited to 75 items or less. Bear in mind that each question/sub-question are considered an item. For example, an item that reads, "To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?" and provides six statements for students to react to should be considered six items.
2. Maintain consistent item presentation. Establish a core set of ACSS items that are presented to all students, in all districts consistently. Presentation consistency should include language, administration platform (online v paper), order of the items and structure of the questions.
3. Limit and explain qualifying or ambiguous language. In the 2016 item, "Have you talked with at least one of your parents about the dangers of tobacco, alcohol, or drug use" the term "parents" was explained as inclusive of biological and non-biological parents. This is a good example of providing clarification to increase the consistency of respondent interpretation.
4. Consider monitoring data by cohort. Given the consistency between the elementary, middle and high school instruments, monitoring student responses by cohort could yield more actionable information than monitoring at the school, district and county aggregate levels alone.
5. Engage focus groups to learn more. All information contained in the ACSS is focused on quantifying instances and levels of agreement. This data, while powerful in its own right, can be an insightful beginning to collecting more advanced data. Consider engaging focus groups to better understand some of what the students have reported and their perceptions on why this is the case.
6. Utilize the data to practice continuous improvement. Consider extracting specific themes from the ACSS to use as a point of data collection for interventions being launched at the school/district level. Data collected from students participating in the intervention could be compared to the aggregate and/or a subset of the ACSS could be administered to a specific group of students pre and post intervention as one data point to understand the intervention's impact.
